SUBJECT:	Passport Guidelines 2023/24 Package

I am writing to you with important information regarding changes to the Passport Program guidelines that will come into effect on April 1, 2023.

These changes include addressing the temporary list of eligible expenses that were added to the Passport guidelines in April 2020 to support recipients in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The temporary expansion of eligible expenses will no longer be in effect as of April 1, 2023. Some of the temporary eligible expenses will be permanently integrated into the Passport guidelines, and some expenses will no longer be eligible.

The ministry is making changes that will provide choice, clarity and flexibility around how recipients can spend their Passport funding. By permanently adding some of the temporary eligible expenses to the Passport Program guidelines, recipients will be better able to participate in services and receive supports that are meaningful to them.

An overview of the key changes to the Passport Guidelines is below. A summary table of the changes is provided in **Appendix A**.

Community Participation Support supplies and equipment

The update to the Passport guidelines includes the **creation** of a new admissible expense category, Community Participation Support supplies and equipment. This new category will be subject to a maximum annual reimbursement amount of **\$2,000** per fiscal year and will include the following types of expenses:

- 1. **Supplies and equipment** to support both organized and general social and cultural activities, such as sports, leisure, recreation, fitness, arts and crafts, learning and skills development
- 2. **Sensory items** that help to support recipient's sensory or behavioural needs. Items that may provide a sensory element but are inadmissible under the Passport Program Guidelines will continue to be inadmissible, for example: furniture, swings, permanent and semi-permanent structures, and household items
- 3. **Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)** consumable supplies such as gloves, masks, gowns, goggles, face shields and hand sanitizer (<u>Note</u>: general household cleaning supplies continue to be inadmissible).

The Community Participation Support supplies and equipment category maximum annual reimbursement amount of **\$2,000** per fiscal year applies to the total expenses across all expense types for this category. This means **the total reimbursement for all recipient's Community Participation Support supplies and equipment items in a year cannot exceed \$2,000 per fiscal year** (April 1 to March 31 the following year).

Technology

Technology-related goods and services will be admissible expenses under the Passport Program guidelines (April 2023) as a new expense category.

This new technology category will be subject to a maximum annual reimbursement amount of **\$3,000** per fiscal year. This means the **total reimbursement for a recipient's technology related goods and services in a year cannot exceed \$3,000 per fiscal year** (April 1 to March 31 of the following year).

Some technology expenses introduced temporarily to assist recipients during the COVID-19 pandemic will return to pre-COVID rules and will no longer be admissible under Passport as of April 1, 2023. Television/cable, streaming and subscription services (Netflix, Disney +, Roku, Spotify, etc.) and gaming related items and subscription services will no longer be admissible when the updated guidelines come into effect on April 1, 2023.

Agencies should be aware of any recipients they support who may have recurring expenses that will no longer be reimbursed when the temporary expansion comes to an end. The Passport program will no longer reimburse these types of services that take place after March 31, 2023. Cancellation fees are not an admissible Passport expense and will not be reimbursed.

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Grace Period for Streaming and Subscription Services

To allow for adequate time to cancel streaming and subscription services (Netflix, Disney+, Roku, Spotify, etc.), the ministry has put in place a grace period for the reimbursement of these types of services. The program will reimburse recipients for subscription services received up to May 31, 2023. Subscription services billing periods after May 31, 2023, will not be reimbursed.

Return to pre-COVID rules

The following types of expenses will return to pre-COVID rules and will no longer be admissible under Passport as of April 1, 2023:

- Behavioural interventions
- Essential service delivery fees

Additional Changes

Other changes include an updated Passport claim form effective April 1, 2023, enhanced accountability provisions and a clarification regarding transportation expenses.

It is recommended that claims are submitted on a monthly basis throughout the year to support the timely processing of claims.

Appendix A: Updates to Passport Guidelines (April 2023)

1. Changes related to the Temporary Expansion

The following table identifies the changes as of April 1, 2023.

Area	Summary of Changes
Home-based supplies and equipment	Supplies and equipment will now be admissible expenses under the April 2023 Passport Program guidelines under a <u>new</u> Community Participation Support supplies and equipment category. A <u>maximum annual reimbursement amount of \$2,000</u> <u>per fiscal year (April 1 to March 31 the following year)</u> will be applied to the overall category.
	This category will include supplies and equipment to support both organized and general social and cultural activities, such as sports, leisure, recreation, fitness, arts and crafts, learning and skills development. Activity fees will remain a separate category and <u>not</u> be subject to the maximum annual amount.
	The Community Participation Support supplies and equipment category will also include sensory items and personal protective equipment and supplies (see below).
Sensory items	Sensory items will be admissible expenses under the April 2023 Passport Program guidelines under the new Community Participation Support supplies and equipment category and will be included within the maximum annual reimbursement amount of \$2,000 per fiscal year (April 1 to March 31 the following year) for the overall category.
	Items that may provide a sensory element but are inadmissible under the Passport Program guidelines will continue to be inadmissible, for example: furniture, swings, permanent and semi-permanent structures, and household items.

Area	Summary of Changes
Personal Protective Equipment and Supplies (PPE)	PPE consumable supplies will be admissible expenses under the April 2023 Passport Program guidelines under the <u>new</u> Community Participation Support supplies and equipment category and will be included within the <u>maximum annual</u> <u>reimbursement amount of \$2,000 per fiscal year (April 1 to</u> <u>March 31 the following year)</u> for the overall category. General household cleaning supplies continue to be inadmissible .
Technology	 Technology related goods and services will be admissible expenses under the April 2023 Passport Program guidelines under its own new category. A maximum annual reimbursement amount of \$3,000 per fiscal year (April 1 to March 31 the following year) will be applied to this category. Some technology items and services will no longer be admissible when the updated guidelines come into effect on April 1, 2023. The following will be inadmissible under the April 2023 Passport guidelines: Gaming related items, including: Gaming consoles Video games Software Hardware Accessories Virtual reality systems Gaming apps and gaming related subscription services (Xbox Live, PlayStation Plus, etc.) and in-game/in-app purchases Television/cable, streaming and subscription services (Netflix, Disney+, Roku, Spotify, etc.) You should review your Passport expenses to identify any recurring expenses (e.g. streaming and subscription services) that will no longer be reimbursed as of April 1, 2023. Cancellation fees for these types of expenses are not admissible under Passport.

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Area	Summary of Changes
Behavioural Interventions	Costs associated with behavioural interventions will no longer be admissible. This temporary enhancement due to the COVID- 19 pandemic will end as of April 1, 2023. Behaviour Support Plans continue to be admissible through the pre-approval process managed by local Passport agencies. You can contact your local Passport agency for more information.
Essential Service Delivery Fees	Costs associated with essential service delivery fees will no longer be admissible. This temporary enhancement due to the COVID-19 pandemic will end as of April 1, 2023.

2. Additional Changes

Area	Summary of Changes
Transportation	 The transportation category introduced in April 2022 was to support you with participating in local social engagements, including visiting family or friends in your home community. The description is being updated to clarify what is an admissible expense. The description is being revised to: Transportation to/from local social engagements and recreational activities in your home community, which may include those with family and friends (excluding personal holiday travel, vacations to visit family/friends and family visits related to custody arrangements). The program recognizes that your community may be in a rural, remote, or northern location and may require you to travel longer distances. The program recognizes that your community may include Indigenous communities which are on or off reserve.

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Area	Summary of Changes
	contact your local Passport agency to make a pre- approval request for reimbursement of airfare costs.
Enhanced Accountability	It is important that you understand what you are accountable for, which means you understand what you can be reimbursed for and other rules of the program. The Passport guidelines have been updated to help explain these changes. The language in the guidelines has been updated to explain these rules and responsibilities more clearly to you and to your Person Managing Funds (PMF). If you do not understand, or have questions, please contact your local Passport agency.
Updated Passport Claim Form	 With the introduction of the April 2023 Passport guidelines, the Passport claim form is being updated. The updated Passport claim form should be used for any expenses that take place after March 31, 2023. If you file your claim electronically, the electronic platforms are updated automatically so you do not need to do anything extra. If you cannot submit claims electronically, please contact your Passport coordinator to request an updated Passport claim form. Your new, personalized claim form will include your name and personal barcode and is for your use only. Do not share your personalized claim form must be used starting April 1, 2023, to avoid processing delays.
