### **Expanding Horizons: Creating Opportunities for Growth, Belonging, and Inclusion**

Throughout the 2024–2025 fiscal year, our agency has proudly continued to focus on providing programming that is inclusive and builds independence while connecting to community. Our programs represent more than just activities - they are carefully designed opportunities that promote empowerment, inclusion and choice.

This work aligns with the Ministry of Children, Community and Social Services' (MCCSS) long-term vision, 'Journey to Belonging: Choice and Inclusion'. We are proud to play an active role in advancing this vision by creating programs that support individuals to live meaningful lives as valued, contributing members of their communities.

## Healthy Relationships & Positive Self-Awareness Workshops

In 2024/2025 Meta Centre delivered two highly successful sessions of our Healthy Relationships and Positive Self-Awareness workshops. Each six-week session was led by certified sexuality educators from Meta Centre and designed to promote understanding, confidence, and communication in relationships.

Participants explored a wide range of topics, including:

- The different types of relationships in life
- How to navigate romantic interest and partnerships
- Online safety and social media awareness
- Building a positive sense of self and understanding boundaries



With small group sizes to ensure engagement, these sessions were open to both individuals we support and members of the broader community—creating a diverse and inclusive learning environment.

## Inclusive & Creative Programming: Creative Expression Through Film



Our 12-week Frame by Frame filmmaking program, in partnership with Renergy Media House, brought together 19 participants to explore the foundations of film creation—covering pre-production, filming, editing, and storytelling.

The program culminated in the Frame by Frame Film Festival on May 12th, 2025, held at City Playhouse Theatre. The event drew a full audience and featured support from Mayor Steven Del Duca of Vaughan, highlighting the community's growing interest in inclusive, creative programming.





#### Self-Expression & Story Telling: Capturing Stories Through the Lens

This year we also launched Feelings of Photography—a 12-week program that gave 18 individuals the opportunity to explore photography as a tool for self-expression and storytelling. Participants learned to capture emotion and perspective through the lens, resulting in a body of work that is both powerful and deeply personal.

We were thrilled to have our first-ever public photography exhibition that took place on September 19th, 2025, where the incredible work of participants was showcased.











#### **Looking Ahead: Expanding Inclusive Programming**

As we look to the future, we are exploring opportunities to enhance our offerings, including the potential for new fee-for-service programs that could serve both the individuals we support and the broader community, which will include a focus on:

- Creative and recreational workshops like our film and photography programs
- Personal development opportunities, like our healthy relationship workshops
- And new programming focused on employment skills, workplace readiness, and vocational exploration

These initiatives will be designed to respond to the evolving needs and interests of the people we serve, while also reaching a broader audience seeking inclusive, enriching, and practical opportunities for growth.

By continuing to diversify our programs, we aim to empower more individuals to discover new passions, develop meaningful life skills, and feel a true sense of belonging.

Together, we're not only expanding services, we're expanding opportunities for belonging and inclusion.


